Running with God is not just a "quick fix" for the problems in our life and in the life of the world, but it includes holding onto the promise that God is with us through the difficult and complex and complicated situations in life.

On October 16 at 10:30 a.m., we run in a new direction as we introduce our new monthly (3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month) contemporary service. Come and check it out!


